Programme Overview

Study a flexible, part-time MSc Cancer Care with The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre NHS Foundation Trust and the University of Liverpool.

Designed for registered nurses and other health and social care professionals who provide care for people with a cancer diagnosis within their care setting, it allows you to undertake master's level study whilst continuing with your current role. The course is also suitable for you if you wish to develop your own practice in the holistic care of cancer patients.



The programme will enable you, working with cancer patients, their carers and families in a variety of care settings throughout the complex cancer journey, to critically explore the evidence base underpinning decision making and best practice. It will enhance your awareness of individual needs and the provision of a holistic, patient centred approach to care.

You can tailor the programme to your area of oncology interest, expertise and practice through your choice of modules; some of which are delivered wholly online. You will further your educational and professional development within the speciality of oncology to drive forward practice improvements, expand the evidence base and ultimately improve care of the cancer patient.

The programme fee is £9,300 (£3,100 per year). Modules available in the programme can be taken as stand-alone for continued professional development (costing £1,030 per 20 credit module).
