

What is a nurse-led Enzalutamide clinic?

A guide for patients and carers

As your Consultant has prescribed you Enzalutamide for your prostate cancer, you will attend a nurse-led Enzalutamide clinic. The clinic is run by senior nurses who specialise in prostate cancer.

How does the clinic work?

- You will be allocated an appointment time to attend the Enzalutamide clinic
- You will need to have a blood sample taken prior to this appointment so that your blood results can be reviewed at your clinic appointment
- You will be assessed by the nurse, this will include:
 - Your general health
 - Record your blood pressure and pulse
 - Inform you of your blood results
 - Review your medication
 - Discuss any problems or concerns you may have

If there is any cause for concern the nurse will refer you to the appropriate health care professional.
